

Addressing and Preventing Adult Sexual Misconduct Live Training by Request

The Readiness and Emergency Management for Schools (REMS) Technical Assistance (TA) Center, in partnership with the U.S. Department of Education, Office of Safe and Supportive Schools, is pleased to offer the Addressing and Preventing Adult Sexual Misconduct training topic in the Train-the-Educator format. Available through the Live Trainings by Request program, this synchronous training provides information on creating policies and procedures for preventing and addressing adult sexual misconduct (ASM) in schools and is presented in person at your school, school district, or education agency. The REMS TA Center will provide — free of charge — training materials, as well as one or more live subject matter expert trainers and staff support for the event hosted at your site.

Live Training by Request Facilitated on-site at your school, school district, or education agency

Learn about how the threat of ASM in the school setting by educators, administrators, staff members, volunteers, or other members of the school community is present against students. To prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from ASM and suspected incidents of ASM, schools should create a <u>comprehensive school emergency operations plan</u> (EOP) that contains an ASM Annex. This training intends to help prepare schools and school districts to develop comprehensive policies and procedures, including policies and procedures for hiring, within their EOPs for preventing and addressing ASM in schools. The training curriculum incorporates the most recent research and trends in ASM, published in <u>A Training Guide for Administrators and Educators on Addressing Adult Sexual Misconduct in the School Setting</u>. To prevent incidents or allegations of sexual misconduct, it is crucial for all school personnel to demonstrate appropriate behavior and recognize questionable behavior before an incident occurs.

- Understand how to better protect students.
